Senators are in their home offices the week of February 18th. Contact them there or use the Capitol Switchboard number 202 224-3121. Ask them to vote NO on these issues that give the U.N. more power over the U.S. Let them know you are watching their positions.

1. The Global Poverty Act

On Wednesday, February 13th, the U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee, by voice vote, passed S. 2433, the Global Poverty Act sponsored by Senator Barack Obama, (D-I). It would commit the U.S. to spending 0.7 percent of the gross national product on foreign aid, *over and above what we already spend.*

2. U.N. Law of the Sea Treaty (LOST)

The U.N. Law of the Sea Treaty (LOST) would put three-fourths of the earth's surface under the control of an International Seabed Authority, rendering the U.S. powerless to explore the seabed without first obtaining a permit costing a minimum of \$250,000. U.S. independence would be further eroded. President Bush indicated his support for LOST when he put \$5 million for it in his 2009 budget request. LOST would force companies that mine the seabed to pay a percentage of their profits as a global tax to the International Seabed Authority.

ACTION – Ask Georgia Senators Johnny Isakson and Saxby Chambliss to vote NO on The Global Poverty Act and the U.N. Law of the Sea Treaty (LOST).
